### HANOVER'S WAYNE PERRY

Wayne Perry has a 141-61-2 record in his 21st season with the Panthers and is the winningest coach in Hanover history. He has led the Panthers to six league titles (1989, 1994, 1995, 1997, 1999 and 2000) and seven national playoff appearances (1984, 1986, 1989, 1995, 1997, 1999 and 2000). He is the third winningest coach in Indiana college football history.

### LAST TIME OUT

Hanover posted its ninth consecutive season-opening win with a 47-14 victory against Urbana University (OH) at L.S. Ayres Field. Thomas More opened the 2002 campaign with a 25-6 victory on the road against Muskingum College (OH).

### PELLEY HONORED

Senior quarterback Justin Pelley was named the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference offensive player of the week for his performance in Hanover's 47-14 victory against Urbana (OH) Sept. 7 at L.S. Ayres Field. Pelley completed 17-of-25 passes for 211 yards and four touchdowns in a limited amount of playing time. He did not throw an interception.

### SCORING STREAK

Hanover has not been shut out in its last 189 games. The Panthers were last held scoreless in a 28-0 setback against Findlay University (OH), Oct. 22, 1983.

The Panthers had a 106-game string reaching double figures snapped in a 13-7 overtime loss at Defiance in 2000.

### OTHER SIDE OF THE LINE

Sophomore wingback John Spurlock played for Thomas More last season. He had one rush for 16 yards and one catch for eight yards in the Saints' 28-21 victory against Hanover at L.S. Ayres Field.

### UNCHARTED TERRITORY

Seven different players scored touchdowns in Hanover's win against Urbana (IL). Of those players, three hit paydirt for the first time in their collegiate careers. Freshman Mike Russell hauled in a nine-yard pass for a score in the second period. Sophomore Clint Bobb scored made a diving catch in the end zone on a 21-yard pass play in the third period. Sophomore Kevin Hall scored on a 22-yard pass from freshman Nick Mahon in the fourth period.

### OUT OF THE GATE

Hanover managed just 14 yards on eight plays through three possessions in the first quarter of the 47-14 win against Urbana (OH) last weekend. The Panthers, which had the ball for only 3:01 in quarter, totaled 470 yards of offense in the final three stanzas.

### POWER-AID

Junior linebacker Scott Power has earned a spot in Hanover's starting lineup since arriving on campus. A transfer from the University of Wisconsin-Platteville, Power played in 20 games in two seasons for the Pioneers. He was second on the squad in 2001 with 72 tackles, including 10 for a loss.

He totaled a team-leading 10 tackles in Hanover's 47-14 win against Urbana (OH).

### ON THIS DATE

Hanover defeated North Central College (IL) 24-13, Sept. 14, 1996, in a night game in Naperville, IL.

Freshman running back Bill Wilcox rushed for 106 yards to lead the Panthers to the squad's 14th consecutive regular-season victory. The streak ended the following week with a 14-13 loss to Centre College (KY).

The 1996 contest was the first of two meetings between Hanover and North Central. The series ended with a 24-7 Hanover win in the second game of the 1997 season.

### PASSING THE COACH

With 211 yards passing against Urbana (IL) last week, senior quarterback Justin Pelley moved past current Hanover offensive coordinator Mike Leonard into 11th place among Hanover's career passing yardage leaders with 2,351 yards.

Leonard threw for 2,343 yards as the Panthers' signal-caller in the early 1980s.

### JOURDAN MOVES UP

With six catches against Urbana (OH) last week, senior wingback Jeffrey Jourdan has moved into a tie for 17th place on the Hanover career receptions list. Jourdan, who has 126 career receptions, is knotted with former Panther Jay Powell in the 17th slot. Powell played for Hanover from 1984 to 1986.

Jourdan is the Panthers' top returning receiver this season. He totaled 68 catches for 819 yards in 2001.

### DEFENSE STEPS UP

Hanover's defensive unit forced four fumbles (recovering three) and swiped an interception last week against Urbana (OH). The Panthers gave up 137 yards in the first 18 minutes of the contest, but allowed just 156 yards in the final 42 minutes of the game.

### CHALK IT UP

Hanover has won its last 25 games when scoring 40 or more points. The Panthers' streak dates back to a 47-45 loss to Taylor University in the eighth game of the 1993 season. The span includes a string of six straight games with 40 or more points during the 1995 season (10-1).

### SEATING FOR SIX

Six former members of the Hanover's football program will be inducted into the Hanover College Athletic Hall of Fame this fall. Jon Pinnick ('87), Mike Luker ('89), Howard Treesh ('50), Pete Corrao ('76), Dan Allen ('78) and Bill Springer ('57) will be among the 10 members of the hall of fame's induction class of 2002.

Pinnick, Luker and Treesh continue to hold numerous school records. Pinnick (1983-1986) was a three-time all-American at quarterback and holds six school passing records. Luker (1985-1988), a two-time all-American at split end, holds six school receiving marks. Treesh (1947-1949) was one of the most prolific rushers in the nation during his era. He continues to hold five Hanover rushing records.

The induction ceremony will be held Friday, Oct. 11, in the J. Graham Brown Campus Center as part of the College's Homecoming festivities.

## ALMOST A SURE THING

Thomas More has had at least one player gain 100 or more yards in five of the previous six games with Hanover.

Ryan Reynolds ran for 206 yards and four scored four touchdowns in 1992. Derrick Jett added 100 yards and one score in that contest. Reynolds ran for 166 yards and a score in 1993.

After a four-year break in the series, the string continued in the 1998 game when Curtis Williams rushed for 121 yards and a touchdown. Hanover kept the Saints' ground game under control in a 45-19 victory in 1999.

In 2000, William Castleberry rushed for 160 yards and two touchdowns. Last season, Williams returned to the Saints' lineup and rushed for 153 yards and a score. Justin Frisk added 140 yards and one touchdown.

## AN EARLY JUMP

Hanover forced four fumbles and recovered three in the win against Urbana (OH) last week. As a team, the Panthers only recovered six fumbles through 10 games last season.

## SPREADING OUT

The Hanover roster has players from seven states, including: Indiana (70 players), Kentucky (19), Ohio (18), South Carolina (1), Texas (1), Florida (4) and Hawaii (1).

## ROUGH AT HOME

For the first time in the modern era of Hanover football, the Panthers are hosting six regular-season home games.

Three of the six home contests are against teams that qualified for the national playoffs last season. Thomas More advanced to the second round last season. Defiance College (OH), which will be Hanover's Homecoming opponent Oct. 12, was knocked out in the first round last season. Washington & Jefferson College (PA), which some feel has a real shot at the national title, will play at L.S. Ayres Field Nov. 2. The Presidents were bumped from the playoffs in the second round last year.

## AN AYRES MILESTONE

Today marks the 28th anniversary of the most lopsided game in L.S. Ayres Field history. On Sept. 14, 1974, the Panthers defeated St. Ambrose (IA) 81-0.

The victory stands as the Panthers' highest point total at Ayres Field and the school's largest margin of victory in a game played at the stadium.

Hanover scored 54 points in the first half and totaled 458 rushing yards in the game. The Panthers limited St. Ambrose to just minus-16 yards on the ground.

## DOWN THE ROAD

DePauw University hosts Hanover next week at Blackstock Stadium in Greencastle, IN. The Tigers host Hope College (MI) in a Community Day game today. DePauw is 1-0 this season after notching a 34-25 victory against Rhodes College (TN) last week in Memphis, TN.
