#### **Web Writing Assignment #1**

Develop a "home" Web page that includes your name, at least one image, a background, a link to this syllabus, an email link, and the date your page was last updated. Add an additional link labeled "Web Writing Assignment #1. On this second page, post a paper investigating in detail one of the issues, projects, initiatives, legal battles, etc. outlined in Lessig's book. Make sure you provide adequate links to back up with analysis. Please use MLA bibliographic style for any works cited. When you are finished, post a link to your paper on the CBP 360 Internet Studies Blog.
